Once a thriving bank, the property later became the much-loved Tree's Café which successfully operated for 20 years. The original bank safe has been cleverly converted into a commercial kitchen, complete with its impressive (and original) 200mm thick safe door and 600mm solid walls. The former banker's office now provides a private dining space, while the old reception area offers a large open dining room with counter space, verandah access, and customer amenities at the rear.
